Table 1A: Types of Impairment and Summary of the Definitions Adopted in this Paper

Type of Impairment	Definition
Psychosocial impairment	Disturbances in a person's behaviour due to mental, emotional, or cognitive experiences (Ringland et al., 2021). This includes anxiety, depression, and other mental health conditions. It is also known as menatal impairment. We favour the use of 'psychosocial impairment' over 'mental impairment' because of the latter's negative connotations.
Developmental impairment	Limitations and delays in cognitive, comunication, motor and/or social abilities, which appear during the 'development period' (Odom et al., 2007), including intellectual disabilities. These include Autism Spectrum Disorder, Attention Deficit Hyperactive Disorder, Down syndrome, cerebral palsy, and learning disabilities.
Sensory impairment	Affect how the human brain processes sensory information from sight, hearing, smell, touch, spatial awareness, and taste (Martinex, 2019). They include deafness, blindness, deafblind, and sensory processing disorder.
Physical impairment	Are 'limitation[s] on a person's physical functioning, mobility, dexterity or stamina' that have 'long-term' effects (Equality Act, 2010).
Congenital impairment	All the impairments developed during intrauterine life, which can be identify before or at birth (Darling 2017).
Acquired impairment	Impairments developed at any point of a person's life due to illness, accidents, violent conflict, or other events.
